

## Let's visualise how you will reach your objectives in English in 2024.

If your objective is to move on the CEFR scale, first estimate how many hours of guided learning per week you will need to move up.



## Task 1: Add your classes to the schedule

**Group Classes.** 1hr/week = approx. 30 hours practice /year, 1.5 = ~45. **Private Classes.** Got a specific objective or want additional classes?

Talk to Adam about the possibility of sharing the costs of private classes with another student, or using your CPF (Separate pricing system applies).

## Task 2: Add more practice during the week.

You're more likely to do regular practice when activities are "effortless" and fun, and when they integrate into your daily routine. Consider this:

- Could you listen to a podcast for 20 minutes each day to and from work? That's an extra 3 hours of practice per week!
- Could you read an article for 10 minutes while you're waiting for food to arrive? Revise for other classes in English?
- Could you stream the football in English this evening, or watch TV with English subtitles instead of none?

Once decided, select the right resources to target areas to improve, and at the right level.

## Study tip #1: Make a language buddy

English should be social! Prioritise meetings in real life. Plan a time to meet up with your classmates outside of class to reinforce your class learning!

As English learners, choosing materials that match your level is essential. Reading texts that are too difficult will be frustrating and demotivating.



**How Many Hours Of Practice To Progress on the CEFR Scale?** 

Cambridge suggests around 200 guided learning hours to progress on the CEFR scale, but individual progress varies due to factors like age -- adults make progress more easily! -first-language influence, training intensity, motivation, and access to resources.


The table below provides an estimate of guided learning hours required for a typical motivated student.
